The Commission appointed by the Governor and Executive Council on May 20, 2009, to determine if there is occasion for the reconstruction of NH 110 in the City of Berlin, will be meeting on Thursday, April 8, 2010, at 11:00 a.m. in Conference Room 205 (Material and Research) at the NH Department of Transportation, 7 Hazen Drive in Concord, NH, to discuss the proposed project. This meeting is a public proceeding under RSA Chapter 91-A. The intent of the meeting is **not** to continue taking testimony as was done at the Berlin Public Hearing, but instead the meeting serves as a decision making forum for the Hearing Commission. The public may observe the proceedings.

The Report of the Commissioner, which addresses all issues raised during the public hearing process, is available. Those interested in obtaining copies should contact Donald Lyford, Project Manager at (603) 271-2165.

This project will be administered according to the requirements of Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964 and related statutes to ensure nondiscrimination.

PROJECT DESCRIPTION

This project involves the reconstruction of NH 110 on new alignment to create a more direct route for the roadway between Green Street and Wight Street, and to remove through traffic from the largely residential neighborhood. The new route of NH 110 will begin on Green Street near the Saint Lawrence and Atlantic Railroad overpass and extend north approximately 3,000 feet, initially following First Avenue, then proceeding adjacent to the Saint Lawrence and Atlantic Railroad tracks, and finally rejoining the existing NH 110 alignment on Wight Street in the vicinity of its intersection with Fourth Avenue.

Minor approach work will also be included at the intersections of NH 110 with Gilbert Street, the remnant of Green Street, Roderick Street, Hillside Avenue, Third Avenue, Fourth Avenue, Fifth Avenue, Boulay Street, Sixth Avenue and Duguay Street. Sidewalks will be constructed along both sides of NH 110.
