Disbursements:

Disbursement Summary Draft #180 start date 12/19/2017 end date 01/08/2018 for a total cash disbursement of \$1,120,598.13. Councilor Theberge moved with a second by Councilor Higbee to accept the disbursement summary and pay all bills as recommended by the Committee on Accounts/Claims. So moved, the motion carried.

A RESOLUTION appropriating the sum of up to Twenty-Eight Thousand Dollars \$28,000.00 from Unappropriated Fund Balance (UFB) to the Public Works Department to purchase a ¾ ton four wheel drive pickup truck.

Resolved by the City Council of the City of Berlin as Follows:

Whereas, the Public Works Department is in need of a pickup truck for use in the general operations of the department; and

Whereas, the Capital funding request for \$150,000 for public work equipment was not funded; and

Whereas, the State of New Hampshire has a contract in place with MacMulkin Chevrolet for 2018 model vehicles; and

Whereas, as a Government entity, the City of Berlin can purchase a 2018 four wheel drive Silverado with towing package for \$27,105.00.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the City Council of the City of Berlin, NH that up to Twenty-Eight Thousand Dollars \$28,000.00 shall be appropriated from Unappropriated Fund Balance (UFB) to the Public Works Department for the purchase of a pickup truck through the State of NH Contract #8002239.

This resolution shall be in full force and effect from and after passage.

Councilor Remillard moved with a second by Councilor Otis to remove the resolution from the table at this time. So moved, the motion carried.

Councilor Remillard moved with a second by Councilor Otis to have the resolution read a second time by title only. So moved, the motion carried.

Councilor Remillard moved with a second by Councilor Otis to have the resolution read a third time by title only. So moved, the motion carried.

Councilor Remillard moved with a second by Councilor Otis to pass the resolution. Roll call resulted in a unanimous vote in the affirmative, the motion carried.

- 1. New City employee, Amanda Cassidy, will be starting work as the Code/Fire Clerk tomorrow, January 3rd. Please join us in welcoming Amanda.
- The City is receiving proposals for a new phone system at the Berlin Police Dept. this week. The proposals will be thoroughly reviewed over the next few weeks before a decision is made.
- 3. We have two Bombardier sidewalk tractors out for bids due January 4th. These are 1978 and 1984 tractors. They have served the City well but are no longer in an operating condition which meets our needs. The PWD Dept. purchased a newer used sidewalk tractor last year to improve our sidewalk plowing and sanding abilities.
- 4. The Berlin Public Works Department will be performing night time snow removal from St. Anne's Church to the Twelfth Street Bridge starting at midnight tonight and going through the early morning hours of Wednesday, January 3rd.
- 5. The first two <u>Legislative Bulletins</u> of the 2018 legislative session produced by NHMA are out. They can be viewed at <u>www.nhmunicipal.org</u>. There are several bills either retained from the 2017 session or new bills issued for the 2018 session which affect municipalities. It is time, once again, to start watching and participating in the process.
