STUDENT REPORT

Dominick Couture and Aric Huter were asked their opinion on the issue of hats, hoodies, and cell phones in school. Dominick agrees with being allowed to wear hats, but does not agree with hoodies. He also feels that cell phone usage should be allowed as long as it can be monitored. Aric Huter feels having access to his cell phone during non academic times can be used as a stress reliever. He also feels hats should be allowed in school, but not hoodies.

Julie King extended a comment to support hoodies if hats are allowed, based on a trauma-sensitive approach. Some students find that they are able to deal with anxiety and trauma in a more positive way when they are able to place a hoodie over their heads to shield them from their surroundings. They feel safe and secluded from so much stimulus in the room.. Matthew Buteau thanked the Administrators and Student Representatives for taking the time to do these reports, with the busy schedule they already have.

The Superintendent informed him they were doing their best to stay on top of this and that Karen Moore, the District Homeless Liaison, was monitoring the situation. Eamon explained that the article in the newspaper was confusing, since it stated the tenants had to be out of the apartments by December 5, 2002; instead of stating that the eviction process was placed in motion. This will give the tenants more time to look into their legal rights and options.

Matthew Buteau thanked Eamon for bringing this to the Board's attention.

Jeanne Charest reminded the Board that not all of the buildings have tenants.

Matthew Buteau stated losing staff is always difficult and thanked the administration for their efforts to help the situation. He also gave praise to the Winter sports athletes and was glad to hear that Varsity Spirit was back at BMHS. The Superintendent mentioned that it was also returning to the Elementary level.

Ann Nolin, who was attending the meeting via zoom, commented that she was not able to hear anything that was being said unless it was done by Matthew Buteau or Julie King.
