Great Lakes Hydro America, LLC (GLHA), a subsidiary of Brookfield Renewable Partners L.P. ("Brookfield"), is the licensee for five run-of-river hydroelectric facilities that are coming up for relicensing. The component projects are Sawmill (FERC No. 2422), Cross Power (FERC No. 2326), Cascade (FERC No. 2327), Gorham (FERC No. 2311), and Shelburne (FERC No. 2300). These assets are in Coös County, New Hampshire in the towns of Berlin, Gorham, and Shelburne, and are part of a larger grouping of eight hydroelectric projects all located within an 11-mile stretch of the Androscoggin River.

Under the Federal Power Act, the Federal Energy Regulatory Commission ("FERC") administers the relicensing of these projects. The existing FERC licenses all expire on July 31, 2024, and GLHA is beginning the relicensing process soon. GLHA will be using the Integrated Licensing Process (ILP), as described at 18 CFR §5.0. Although GLHA intends to apply for separate licenses for each project, the relicensing will combine as many elements as possible. Accordingly, GLHA is preparing separate Notices of Intent (NOI) to relicense the Berlin projects and a single Pre-Application Document (PAD) to be filed by July 31, 2019. The PAD will provide FERC and other entities with existing, relevant, and reasonably available information pertaining to the Berlin projects as well as resources within the vicinity of the projects.


