A RESOLUTION authorizing the Berlin Police Commission to apply for and accept \$3,387.00 (Three Thousand, Three Hundred Eighty-Seven Dollars) in grant funds from the NH Department of Safety for the purpose of effectuating Homeland Security training, and appropriating said funds to the Berlin Police Department Fiscal Year 2018 Budget for the purpose of effectuating the grant.

Resolved by the City Council of the City of Berlin as Follows:

WHEREAS the safety of Berlin's citizens is imperative; and

WHEREAS terrorist activity remains a viable threat; and

WHEREAS the State of New Hampshire, Department of Homeland Security recognizes this threat and is taking measures in preparation of meeting such threats; and

WHEREAS the Department of Homeland Security has Law Enforcement Terrorism Prevention Activities Special Operations Team (LETPA-SOT) program funds available to conduct training exercises designed to test planning, communications, and interoperability for events necessitating a multi-jurisdictional response; and

WHEREAS participation in said exercises enhance response capabilities as well as highlight areas that need improvement.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the City Council of the City of Berlin, NH, that the Berlin Police Commission is authorized to apply for and receive grant funds from the NH Department of Safety for the purpose of effectuating said LETPA-SOT Homeland Security training. Further, the sum of \$3,387.00 (Three Thousand, Three Hundred Eighty-Seven Dollars) is hereby appropriated to the Berlin Police Department Fiscal Year 2018 Budget, in addition to all previously-appropriated funds.

This resolution shall be in full force and effect from and after passage.
