City Council Work Session November 13, 2017

Present were: Mayor Grenier, Councilors Otis, Gentili, Morgan Allain, Higbee, Nelson and Remillard Councilors Rozek and Theberge were absent.

Others present: City Manager Jim Wheeler, Michael Perreault, Angela Martin Giroux, George Fortier and Barbara Tetreault *Berlin Daily Sun*

Mayor Grenier opened the meeting at 6:30 p.m.

Prior to beginning, Mayor Grenier stated that the Council needed to officially certify the election and that matter will need to be added under other items. Councilor Nelson moved, with a second from Councilor Morgan Allain, to add the Certification of the Election results to other on the agenda. So moved, the motion carried.

Infrared Video

City Manager, Jim Wheeler, presented videos to the Mayor and Council which showed how the infrared system worked for street/asphalt repair.

Mr. Wheeler stated what the City is looking at for equipment is referred to as a 2 ton mini-combo, which on the low end would cost approximately \$59,500. This type of infrared equipment uses recycled asphalt with the addition of emulsion. Instead of being on an actual vehicle, this is something that will come on a tow behind trailer. It burns LP gas to heat the asphalt that is being repaired. It is anticipated that the expense of the actual purchase could be split between the sewer/general/water works budgets.

Councilor Nelson asked how the City employees will be trained to use the equipment. Messrs. Wheeler and Perreault stated that the manufacturer would be involved. Councilor Remillard asked what the expected life cycle is. That question will be asked of the manufacturer.

Mr. Wheeler stated that his intention would be to place this item in the upcoming budget, and that he will be speaking with Superintendent Craig Carrigan, Berlin Water Works, regarding budgeting. He feels that this equipment could be purchased and used as one entity, the City. He feels that while BWW is separated, in certain ways, it is all still a part of the City itself. Councilor Morgan Allain asked if just anyone will be operating the equipment. It was noted that specific employees will be trained, not all staff. She also suggested other manufacturers be looked into. Mr. Wheeler said that this item will go out to bid. He also stated that he would ask those that bid to note any deviances from the original bid package so there is a definitive understanding of each piece of equipment. Mayor Grenier said that he was concerned about lead time for delivery of this piece of equipment. He suggested that it may be prudent to purchase the equipment prior to finalizing the budget so the entire summer season is not lost prior to receiving the equipment. However, he did note that this would require a two-thirds vote from the Council.

Vendor License

City Clerk Elaine Riendeau presented the Mayor and Council with a memo regarding hawker/peddler licenses as they relate to local events such as Drive into the 50's, Jericho ATV Festival, RiverFire, etc. She stated that based on a recent incident this fall, it was a matter that needed to be thought about. Any person/business that sells merchandise and/or food within the State of NH is required to purchase a hawkers/peddlers license from the NH Secretary of State's office. The City also has an ordinance that covers this matter. The State's fee for this license

is \$50.00 per year and the City's fee is \$100.00. Both licenses are good for one year from the date of issue and must be purchased for any person who handles the sales/cash transaction. Health Office Angela Martin-Giroux stated that it is her understanding that a license is not required for short-term events. Ms. Riendeau stated that state law does in fact require licenses whether it is a one day event, or something long term.

Councilor Nelson expressed a great deal of concern regarding this matter stating that there are too many fees for the vendors as it stands. She is concerned that if more fees are added, vendors will not want to participate in some of the events. RiverFire is one event that is an unknown as it relates to attendance. Mayor Grenier stated that he did not want to lose any events/vendors due to fees.

Further discussion took place regarding this matter and it was agreed that during a future work session, a committee, that included the Chamber, Main Street Program and Police Chief Morency, would be created so that this matter can be further researched.
