City Manager's Report

- 1. The airport runway has been re-opened as of last Thursday. The pavement sealing project was completed two weeks ahead of the 3 to 4 week schedule projection. Temporary markings have been placed until the seal-coat cures. We are expecting permanent markings to be applied at the end of September. Carol Niewola of the NHDOT Aeronautics will come to the Airport at the end of September to meet with HEB Engineers and Axtell to view the runway work and would like to have a ribbon cutting at the same time. Council will be kept informed once plans are finalized.
- 2. There will be a Public Hearing on the State's 10 Year Transportation Plan on Thursday, September 19th, at 1:00 p.m. in the City Hall Auditorium. The purpose of the Ten Year Plan is to develop and implement a plan allowing New Hampshire to fully participate in federally supported transportation improvement projects as well as to outline projects and programs funded with State transportation dollars. The document can be viewed on DOT's web site.
- 3. Members of the Berlin City Hall Employee's Association have petitioned the PELRB to join AFSCME Council 93 and end their affiliation with OPEIU. A copy of the petition is attached.
- 4. The second public input Economic Development Strategy meeting will be provided and facilitated by Camoin Associates on Sept. 11th at 6:00 PM at the WMCC.
- 5. The second Emergency Operations Plan update meeting will be held on September 10th at 9:00 AM at the WMCC. The effort is being managed by Mapping and Planning Solutions of Whitefield, NH. A Planning Team of emergency operations personnel and agencies will meet approximately 4 to 6 times until the update is completed. The first meeting was held on August 14th at Berlin City Hall.
- 6. NH Employment Security will be holding its annual Fall Job Fair on September 26th from 1:00pm-4:00pm, at St Anne's Hall on School St. Employers are encouraged to attend and participate.

When it is necessary for a public employer to display copies of the petition at diverse locations because bargaining unit employees work at sites remote from the place where the administration of the public employer is located, copies of the petition shall be mailed to those remote locations no later than the next working day following receipt of the petition. The copies so mailed shall be displayed at those remote locations on the same day they are received.

The public employer shall forward to the board as expeditiously as possible a complete list of the names of the employees in the existing bargaining unit so the board can determine the sufficiency of the confidential authorization cards.

9. Exceptions, Objections, and Petitions to Intervene shall be filed within 15 days of the date this petition is filed with the board, and shall be submitted electronically at pelrb@nh.gov or (if unable to file electronically) by mail or other delivery to: NH Public Employee Labor Relations Board, 2 ½ Beacon Street, Suite 200, Concord, NH, 03301.
