Dear Mr. Warren,

On behalf of A.V. Home Care Services, and in keeping with our tradition of presenting the Mayor and Council with an update during Home Care Month in November, I am pleased to provide the City of Berlin with this summary of pertinent data points relative to our use of the City's \$10,000 2022 allocation.

As you are aware, AVHCS is licensed with the State of New Hampshire, Bureau of Elderly and Adult Services, to provide in-home care for seniors, debilitated, and frail adults so they might live safely and contentedly at home. Our services include nursing, LNA bath care, homemaker, and respite.

Access to quality care is, and always has been, our primary goal for our clients and families and for this, a stable workforce is an imperative. The toll of a protracted pandemic and punishing inflation has resulted in a shortage of qualified applicants for our vacant positions, lasting for months at a time.

In response, the AVHCS Board of Directors and Leadership Team have worked diligently to examine wage scales, training requirements, and hiring incentives to be competitive (yet budgetarily realistic) in our efforts to attract experienced applicants. AVHCS secured ARPA and IDN grant funds in late 2021, and these are being used to offset recruitment and retention expenses.

As of this writing, AVHCS has successfully filled 3 of 5 LNA positions with experienced LNAs. We have hired 4 Family Providers (family and friends who care exclusively for one client). Family Providers have greatly eased our staffing shortage by supporting their friend or family member, who is a client of AVHCS, with a stipend-level wage.

In addition, I assumed the Executive Director position vacated by Tara MacKillop in May and have hired a full time RN as Clinical Director to assure quality of services across all levels of care, Samantha Couture. She and the Nurse Supervisors have worked hard to chip away at our Waiting List, down from 69 in August to 24 at this time.

A few other notable data points for the City of Berlin are as follows:

- 1. Hours of service rendered January through June 2022: 12,525
- 2. Number of residents served January through June 2022: 167
- 3. Mileage reimbursement adjustment due to inflation of gas prices, July 2022:

Federal reimbursement rate of 62.5 cents per mile, from .50 per mile

Of additional interest:

Total miles driven by AVHCS staff for all clients in first half 2022: 76,066 miles in Coos County, costing \$38,000 = 950 hours

2. Funding Sources Supplanted: State of NH General Fund Social Service Block Grant TIIIB Older Americans Funds Veteran's Administration Choices for Independence, Medicaid

Finally, we understand that you and the Mayor and Council need to show the taxpayers of Berlin that their investment is worth their tax dollars. We hope that when weighed against the dollar value of your allocation, consideration is made of the following "soft" benefits:

- Well-trained staff are serving our most vulnerable population, who often have no support persons to help them live safely and well at home.
- These staff persons establish relationships with our elderly, sick, poor, and isolated, and become invested in their welfare over time.
- AVHCS staff report changes and concerns to our nurses as they arise and the nurses followup with appropriate state and local entities as needed.
- AVHCS staff become a critical conduit to the "outside world," bringing groceries, picking up medications at the pharmacy, providing news and stimulation and reassurance.
- AVHCS staff quells that fear, unexpressed by frail persons living alone at home, that they will be unable to continue living there, a dread that becomes reality without assistance, AND a reality that costs taxpayers inordinately more money to support.

Our mission to serve people in need, our work to find the resources to cover the cost of service, is driven by deep commitment and a belief that all people deserve a chance to live in their own homes, regardless of their circumstances. Your allocation bolsters our ability to do that and reflects your own commitment, to quality of <u>community life</u> for everyone, the City's most vulnerable included.
